## Horses Should Be Vaccinated for EEE and West Nile Virus

Alabama Agriculture and Industries Commissioner John McMillan recently announced that the first positive case of Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) has been detected in

Alabama.

"This is the time of year that we are extremely vulnerable to the spread of mosquito-borne viruses and we need to protect our livestock and ourselves," McMillan said. "I want to encourage horse owners to vaccinate their horses for both EEE and West Nile Virus as soon as possible."

EEE is a mosquito-transmitted disease that is much more severe than West Nile Virus (WNV). The mortality rate in horses from WNV is reported at around 30 percent, while the rate for EEE is almost 90 percent. Infected mosquitoes are the primary source for EEE. The virus causes inflammation or swelling of the brain and spinal cord. General symptoms include central nervous system

## 3RD ANNUAL AG DISCOVERY ADVENTURE OFFERS DRONE DEMOS AND MORE

Drones may be controversial for use in military and national security matters, but the unmanned aerial vehicles are poised to revolutionize agriculture. Those who attend the 2014 Ag Discovery Adventure Saturday, Sept. 13, at Auburn University's E.V. Smith Research Center, in

Shorter, will have the chance to witness firsthand why and how that's expected to happen.

Drone demonstrations are among the many entertaining activities lined up for the third annual Ag Discovery Adventure, set from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the research unit,

located between Montgomery and Auburn at Interstate 85's Exit 26.

The event, which is free and open to all, is co-hosted by the Alabama Agricultural Experiment Station, the Alabama Cooperative Extension System and Auburn University's College of Agriculture to increase public awareness of 21st-century agriculture.

"Ag Discovery Adventure provides education around how our food and fiber are produced today and the science and technology needed to help the ag industry meet the future demand of the world population," said John Fulton, Auburn biosystems engineering professor, Extension precision agriculture specialist and co-chair of the event.

In addition to the drone flights, the event also will feature a corn maze, insect hunts, a pumpkin patch, farm

**USDA Notice**

Alabama farmers should receive written notification from the U.S. Department of Agriculture providing updates on current base acres, yields and a 2009-2012 planting history.  
Farmers should cross-check the USDA letter with their farm records. If the letter is incomplete or incorrect, contact the local FSA office as soon as possible.  
Verifying the accuracy of data is a required early step for enrolling in the upcoming Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and the Price Loss Coverage (PLC) programs.  
In winter, all producers will be required to make a one-time, unanimous and irrevocable election between price protection and county revenue protection or individual revenue protection for ARC or PLC for the 2014 and 2015 crop years.

**SHEEP AND GOAT SCRAPIE PROGRAM AVAILABLE**

The Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries' State Veterinarian Dr. Tony Frazier recently announced the development of the FY2014/2015 Sheep and Goat Scrapie Surveillance program. This program is in partnership with the USDA/APHIS/VS and is an effort to increase the surveillance for the disease "Scrapie" in sheep and goats in Alabama.

Scrapie is a fatal, degenerative disease affecting the central nervous system of sheep and goats. It is in the same class of diseases as bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) in cattle and chronic wasting disease (CWD) in elk and deer. There is no cure or treatment for Scrapie.

Participation in the Scrapie Surveillance program can be in

one of two ways:

First will be the opportunity for a free necropsy or post mortem examination for a sheep or goat that has died on the farm. The necropsy will be an effort to determine the cause of death by the Alabama State Diagnostic Labs. The labs are located in Auburn, Boaz, Hanceville and Elba. The animals must be 14 months of age or older as evidenced by the eruption at the gum line of one or more adult incisors to qualify for the free necropsy.

Second, a reimbursement of \$25 will be paid by direct deposit from the USDA for the cost of the proper disposal of the sheep or goat carcass that has died on the farm. Certain tissue must be collected from the head of the animal by the lab. The producer may deliver the

head to one of the labs or contact a state or federal field employee for assistance. These animals must also be 14 months of age or older. Proper disposal of the carcass must be according to Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries guidelines for disposal of livestock mortalities.

As a reminder, the Alabama Scrapie Eradication program requires that all sheep and goats be officially identified before change of ownership, prior to moving across state lines and before going to a show, fair, petting zoo or exhibition.

7. Ads for the classified section will not be accepted from dealers, merchants or commercial establishments.
8. Ads received by fax or e-mail must be received by 5 p.m. on the 10th day of the month and ads received by regular mail must be postmarked by 5 p.m. on the 12th day of the month in order to appear in the following month's issue. The e-mail address is [afcb@agi.alabama.gov](mailto:afcb@agi.alabama.gov) and the fax number is 334/240-7169.

## ARCU RECOVERS STOLEN FARM EQUIPMENT

Alabama Law Enforcement Agency's Agricultural & Rural Crime Unit (ARCU) recovered 11 pieces of farm equipment totaling \$489,041 that was stolen from six different states including Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, Arkansas, Tennessee and North Carolina.

ARCU agents arrested Jody D. Morgan, 53, and Steven Ray Parker, 38, both of Albertville, for receiving stolen property first-degree. Both men were booked at the Etowah County Detention Center with additional charges pending in Marshall County.

"Our agents specialize in agricultural and rural crimes and work closely with local law enforcement throughout the state," said ARCU Commander Gene Wiggins. Over the past year, ARCU agents have investigated over 100 cases and recovered more than \$2 million in stolen property.

The ARCU was the first unit established as part of the consolidation of state law enforcement agencies. To report a rural crime or to provide a tip, call 1-855-75CRIME.

After graduating from the University of Alabama, Armstrong took a job in Birmingham as a salesman. However, after about a year, he decided to move back to Selma and give entrepreneurship a try.

After exhausting a few other ideas, Armstrong decided it was time to dive in and fulfill his promise to Gammy by creating a business with her cookies. "I took a lien against my car and started the Selma Good Co. LLC. I was 24 and had absolutely no clue what I was doing," Armstrong says.

Armstrong hired a local design firm to create some logos and

design labels for the packaging.

"For the next few weeks, Gammy taught me everything there was to know about baking her cookies. It is an extremely tedious process by the way!"



Armstrong found an old closed down restaurant with a small kitchen hidden in the back of a larger warehouse in the historic district of Selma. After a few weeks of learning just how hard baking really is, Armstrong finally figured it out and filled the first few orders to three local stores.

"I had lots of help getting started from some great people...small towns are where it's at," Armstrong says.

For the next year and a half, the business grew from three stores to over 35 around the state. However, Armstrong couldn't keep up with the growth. "We had to put the business on hold until we could figure out another route," Armstrong says.

## POULTRY CONSUMPTION GROWS

According to the National Chicken Council, which commissioned a survey by PKS Research Partners of 1,019 adults, the average number of meals or snacks that contain chicken eaten by survey respondents in the two weeks prior to the survey was 6.1. This is up from 5.2, or 17 percent, from the 2012 findings. Millennials (ages 18-34) remain the most likely to eat chicken meals/snacks frequently (7.7).

In the 2014 survey, respondents were asked about likely changes in chicken consumption from a grocery store and in behavior regarding a food service establishment. Twenty-four percent said they would be eating more chicken from a grocery store, which is three times the proportion previously noted. In addition, 20 percent said they are likely to buy more chicken at restaurants.

signs such as: head pressing, convulsions, lack of response to facial stimulation, fever above 103 degrees, ataxia, paralysis, anorexia, depression and stupor. Other symptoms may include irregular gait, teeth grinding, in-coordination, circling and staggering. All symptoms may not be exhibited by an infected horse.

McMillan and State Veterinarian Dr. Tony Frazier recommend vaccinating your horses every six months against both EEE and WNV. Horse owners are encouraged to contact their local veterinarian

to schedule a vaccination for their horses. The public is also advised to make every effort to reduce human exposure to mosquitoes during this time of year.

The horse positive for EEE in Alabama was from Escambia County.


