ADT Rule Change Information

- New rule goes into effect November 5, 2024
- · Official ear tags must be visually and electronically readable
 - Only electronic IDs (EID) meet this requirement
- · Cattle with existing metal tags are grandfathered in
- · EID changes only apply to new tags being applied

Accepted Forms of Official Identification

- Official Ear Tags
 - Tags with US Shield, beginning with "840" (see photo)
 - Metal tags applied BEFORE November 5, 2024
 - DOES NOT include RFID tags that start with 9 (900 series tags)

<u>Types of Cattle Required to have EID</u> <u>Tags</u>

- Beef Cattle
 - 18 months of age or older
 - At change of ownership within the state of Alabama (AL Code Section 80-3-6-.40)
- Dairy Cattle
 - Female dairy cattle of any age
 - Male dairy cattle born after March 11, 2013
- Cattle of any age being used for shows, exhibitions, rodeos, or recreational events
- Cattle vaccinated for brucellosis are required to have an official ID, even if not crossing state lines (see photo)
- Some regulatory tests, such as bulls tested for trichomoniasis, also require official ID

Changes to Official ID Tags

- Official ear tags applied after the rule goes into effect must be readable visually & electronically
- DOES NOT require that producers or veterinarians purchase RFID readers because the tags are visually readable

More Information

- It is illegal to remove an official tag
- No information other than the tag number is stored within the tag
- Excludes any cattle or bison that are going directly to slaughter
