SUBJECT: Interstate Movement Requirements for New World Screwworm Detection  
EFFECTIVE: June 5, 2026

Effective immediately and in accordance with this Notice, due to a detection of New World Screwworm in the United States, the Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries will enforce additional interstate movement health requirements for warm-blooded animals entering Alabama from infested states.

All warm-blooded animals entering Alabama *from an infested zone* must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) from an authorized representative declaring all animals listed on the CVI were given effective treatment for NWS. The CVI must also include the statement, “All animals listed on the CVI have been inspected and are free from screwworm larvae infestation.” Additionally, the following requirements shall also apply:

1. The CVI must include an entry permit number, as approved by the Alabama State Veterinarian’s Office, at least 48 hours prior to entry into Alabama. 2. All animals must be inspected within 5 days of movement ([Pre-Movement Animal Inspection Checklist](#)).
3. The CVI shall be valid for no more than 7 days from the date of inspection.
4. The CVI must document the effective treatment by listing the treatment, the treatment’s date, route of administration, medication, and the full name and signature of the authorized representative. All effective treatments must be administered by or directly overseen by an authorized representative. Effective oral or injected treatments must be administered no less than 12 hours and no more than 14 days prior to entry into Alabama. Effective topical treatments must be administered no less than 72 hours and no more than 14 days prior to entry into Alabama.
5. Any animal in the shipment that is suspected of having NWS myiasis should be removed from the shipment.

All warm-blooded animals entering Alabama *from outside an infested zone but within a surveillance zone or infested state* must be accompanied by a CVI declaring that all the animals listed on the CVI were inspected and found free of NWS. The CVI must include the statement, “All animals listed on the CVI have been inspected and are free from screwworm larvae infestation.” All animals must be inspected within 5 days of movement. The CVI shall be valid for no more than 7 days from the date of inspection.
