It's me, Alexander! I am so glad to be back for another adventure in Alabama agriculture!


As you might remember, I am Alexander the rabbit, and I want you to join me on my SECOND journey to learn more about Alabama's agricultural industry.




Pecans are a very popular product grown in Alabama.

If Alexander were a pecan farmer, what do you think his pecan trees would look like? Draw what you think Alexander's pecan orchard would look like.











Alexander, can you name the different kinds of fruits grown in our state? Use the pictures below to help unscramble the types of items farmed in Alabama.






Alexander wants to fill his basket with a healthy variety of fruits and vegetables. Help him collect them and then find his way to the basket at the end of the maze.




Many Alabama farmers grow products that have several different uses.

It is time to harvest the crops. In the word search on this page, find the hidden words. These are all terms related to farming and harvesting in Alabama.




