


Recent Events

The Farm to School Program, in partnership with Sweet Grown Alabama, hosted a "Sweet Grown Alabama Plate Day" in Montgomery County. All Montgomery County Public Schools participated in "Sweet Grown Alabama Plate Day." The students enjoyed a lunch featuring products sourced directly from Alabama farmers. Roughly 18,000 pounds of Alabama grown and produced products were distributed throughout the cafeterias of the schools. Items served were beef from Mason Hills Farm in Grand Bay, grape and slicer tomatoes from Boatwright Farms LLC in Steele, lettuce and cucumbers from Extreme Green Farms in Auburn, satsumas from GCC&P Cooperative in Fairhope, and sweet potatoes from Sirmon Farms in Daphne, processed into fries by Glyen Holmes in Webb. ADAI staff attended lunch at Booker T. Washington Magnet High School and enjoyed this local meal!
